

Hebrew Bible Reading

1 Kings 19.3-11, *The Message*

When Elijah saw how things were, he ran for dear life to Beersheba, far in the south of Judah. He left his young servant there and then went on into the **desert another day's journey. He came to a lone broom bush and collapsed in its shade, wanting in the worst way to be done with it all—to just die: “Enough of this, GOD! Take my life—I'm ready to join my ancestors in the grave!”** Exhausted, he fell asleep under the lone broom bush. Suddenly an angel **shook him awake and said, “Get up and eat!”** He looked around and, to his surprise, right by his head were a loaf of bread baked on some coals and a jug of water. He ate the meal and went back to sleep.
