| provides restaurant gift certificates to families/individuals in crisis. Food signups are handled through www.foodtidings.com. |
| □ Decorations Committee: A festive group that supervises decorating church spaces for special events. |
| ☐ Green Flamingoes Committee: Concerned about Earth's future, it explores and recommends |
| ways the church and individuals can better care for creation. Hospital Ministry Team: Conveys love, concern, and encouragement through visits to and |
| prayer for those in the hospital and their families. |
| ☐ Helping Hands Ministry Team: Serves as God's hands, feet, and occasional strong back. |
| Helps folks with physical limitations that prevent them from performing simple jobs, individuals |

| and families on moving day, and those whose routine has been disrupted by illness, injury, or death. |
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| ☐ Homebound Ministry Team: Conveys love, concern, and encouragement through visits to and prayer for those confined to home or long-term care facility. |
| ☐ Information Technology (IT) Committee: Troubleshooting techno-Christians who oversee the procurement, maintenance, and general use of all office equipment, such as phones, faxes, and computers. |
| ■ Meet & Greet Ministry Team: Makes people feel welcomed, comfortable, and a part of our community of faith. Writing notes, hosting meals, and organizing new member classes are some of the responsibilities of this team. Visitor note writer only (on a rotating schedule) |
| ☐ Prayer Ministry Team: Looks after the prayer concerns and needs of our church family, including writing notes, traveling with a list of concerns, and praying on the road to work. Also encourages the prayer life of our church. |
| Resettlement Committee: Helps the church welcome and serve a refugee family being resettled in Greensboro. These folks have the gift of hospitality that crosses cultures. I speak an additional language(s): |
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| Social Committee: Fosters fellowship within the church by planning and supervising church social activities. Be part of the fun. |
| ☐ Transportation Committee: Offers rides to and from the church for students, the elderly, and disabled with no other means to get here. Angels with wheels instead of wings. |
