Exodus 2.1-10 The Schocken Bible

Now a man from the house of Levi went and took (to wife) a daughter of Levi. The woman became pregnant and bore a son. When she saw him-that he was godly, she hid him, for three months. 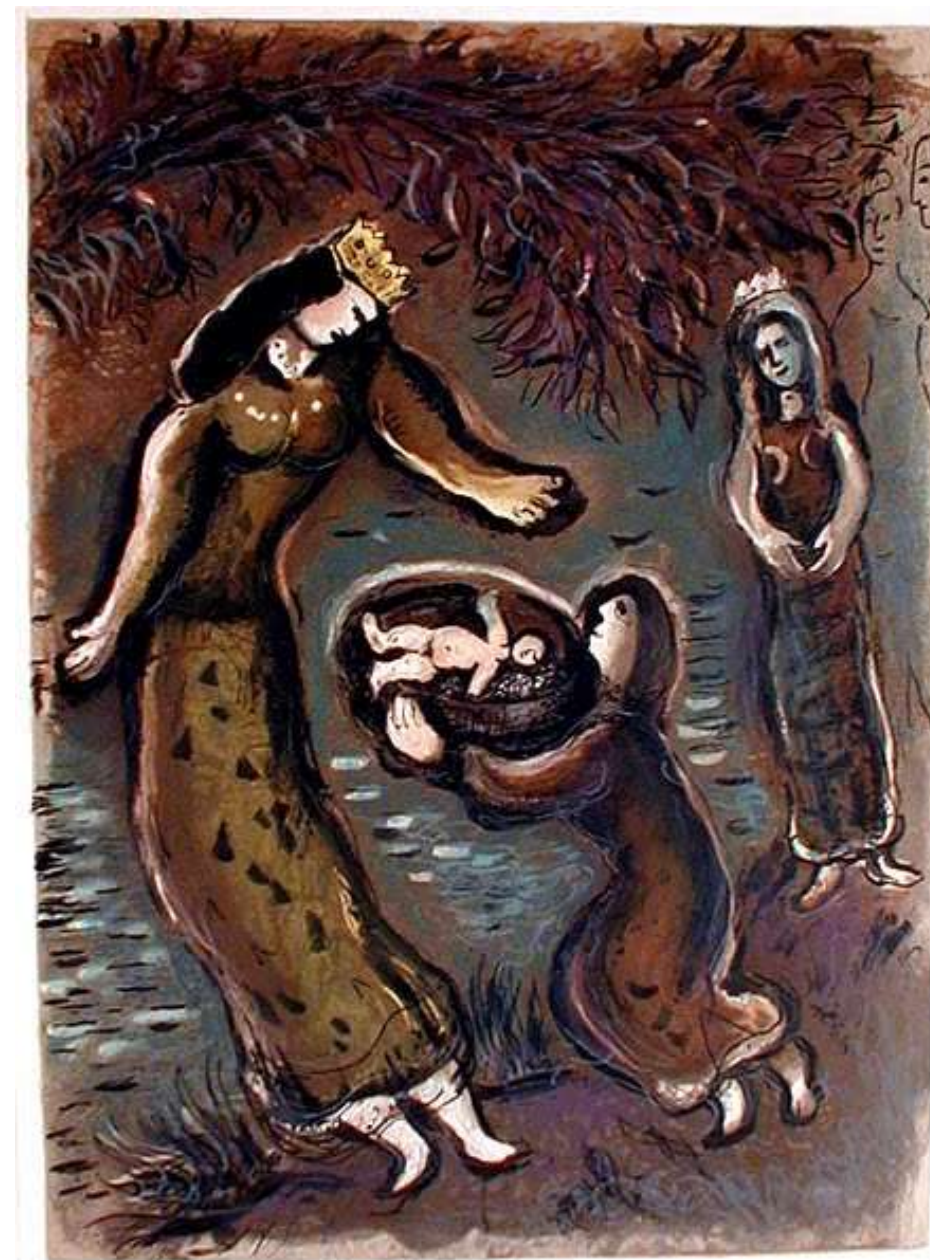
